IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

Note : Read the Prospectus carefully before filling the Application form

1. Strictly adhere to last date for submission of admission form. No representation will be entertained for rejection of form, if received after the scheduled date.
2. Ensure fulfilling of qualifications prescribed for admission to the relevant programme. Form should be filled in carefully and no column be left blank. Once form is submitted, no change in category is permissible. In case category is not clearly indicated in column No. 2 of admission form, it will be treated for 'General Category'.
3. Responsibility for submission of complete admission form and proper documents by the prescribed date is of the candidate. Non- submission of documents by the due date or non-production of original documents at the time of counselling shall make a candidate ineligible for admission.
4. Attendance in person at the time of counselling is compulsory. Candidate must mark his/her attendance by putting his/her full signatures so as to be eligible for consideration at the counselling.
5. After payment of dues at the time of counselling, registration on scheduled date is a must, failing which admission shall stand automatically cancelled and the deposited dues shall be forfeited.
6. Every student is required to attend at least 75% of the lectures delivered and practicals conducted, separately in each course from the start of the classes of a semester, for being eligible to appear in the examination.
7. Name of such student shall be struck off whose attendance in aggregate is below 33% at the end of the academic year.
8. **Ragging is banned with zero tolerance in the University. The University has adopted the UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009 as well as the directions of the Hon'ble Apex Court.**
9. **If any incidence of ragging comes to the notice of the University Authority, action will be taken as per above rules.**

CHAPTER - III

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING ADMISSIONS

1. ADMISSION FORM AND PROSPECTUS

1.1 Candidates seeking admission to the University in any degree programme may obtain Prospectus and the Admission form from the Registrar, Lala Lajpat Rai University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Hisar- 125 004 on cash payment of ₹2000/- (₹500/- for SC & BC), ₹3000/- for **NRI/NRI sponsored/Industry sponsored candidate on counter** or ₹2050/ (₹550/- for SC & BC and ₹3200/- for **NRI/NRI sponsored /Industry sponsored candidate**) by registered parcel on making the payment through a crossed Indian Postal Order/Bank draft in favour of Comptroller, LLRUVAS, Hisar- **payable at Hisar.**

1.2 Last date for receipt of Admission Forms for 1st as well as 2nd semester admissions is as under:

Prospectus shall be on sale from 16. 5. 2011 for 1st Semester for B.V.Sc. & A.H., M.V.Sc. & Ph..D. Programmes and from 03.11.2011 for 2nd Semester for vacant seats of Ph.D. programme only.

1.3 Submission of admission forms:

Candidates seeking admission in any programme should apply on the prescribed form alongwith all the required documents by the prescribed date to the Registrar, LLRUVAS, Hisar.

Late fee be sent through Indian Postal Order/crossed demand draft issued in favour of Comptroller, LLRUVAS, Hisar, payable at Hisar.

Note: Fee paid shall neither be refunded nor adjusted under any circumstances.

1.4 Candidates seeking admission to M.V.Sc. programme in the College of Veterinary Sciences may apply on one Admission form. The 'Choice of discipline/subject normally depends upon eligibility and availability of seat in the discipline concerned.

2. PROCEDURE OF ADMISSION-CUM-COUNSELLING IS AS UNDER

General Rules for Under-graduate and Post-graduate programmes:

- 2.1 Admission forms received after the scheduled date shall be rejected straightway. Admit Cards will not be issued in cases where late fee, if applicable, is not attached with admission form. Candidates should ensure submission of documents as per rule 5.8 of this chapter. Deficiencies be removed by the date fixed for first counselling failing which the candidate shall not be considered for admission. The Competent Authority reserves the right to reject any admission form for reasons to be recorded in writing.
- 2.2 All eligible candidates must report themselves on the date and time for Counselling failing which they will have no claim for admission. No separate letter in this connection shall be issued.
- 2.3 Candidates are required to bring relevant original documents on the date of counselling (fixed for them) failing which they shall be refused admission. Original documents of admitted candidates shall be retained by Registrar's office and temporarily provided to the candidate on demand for a week or the candidates shall have to return original certificates a day before the second counselling, whichever is earlier and if not returned by the date committed, admission shall stand automatically cancelled. Finally, these will be returned to the candidates through the Dean within one month after cut off date/registration whichever is later.
- 2.4 Admissions will be completed at 2nd (final) counselling which will be the cut off date for admissions against vacant seats, if any.

3. POSTGRADUATE PROGRAMMES

- 3.1 Admission Committee for the Post-graduate programmes will be as under:

- 3.2 The candidate before reporting to the Admission Committee should see the latest position of the number of seats available on the chart. The candidate should then present himself/herself before the Admission Committee and give an undertaking **regarding choice of discipline**. Thereafter, he/she will be allowed provisional admission on the basis of merit, as per rules and subject to availability of seats. The candidates admitted shall have to pay fee there and then and register themselves on due date (s) failing which they will forfeit their claim of admission.

4. ENTRANCE TEST - B.V.Sc. & A.H.

- 4.1 All candidates including NRI sponsored/industry sponsored (except NRI or his/her ward) seeking admission to B.V.Sc.&A.H. programme will have to appear in Entrance Test (ET) to be held at Hisar on 26.6.2011 (Sunday) at 10.00 a.m.

- 4.2 Candidates who fulfil the minimum eligibility conditions or have appeared in 10+2 or equivalent examination with required subjects (even if result is yet to be declared), shall be issued admit cards by UPC post (those candidates whose result is not declared will be issued provisional admit cards). In case admit card is not received, the candidate should contact in person the office of Registrar from 22.6.2011 to 24.6.2011 by 2.00 p.m. for issuing of duplicate Admit Card on payment of charges of ₹ 200/- in cash. **For this purpose, candidate should bring one exactly the same recent attested coloured passport size photograph as pasted on Admission Form and Admit Cards.**

Entry to the test centres shall be allowed with valid Admit Card Only.

- 4.3 Syllabus:

- (i) Syllabus of entrance test will be same as the syllabi of 10+1 and 10+2 of Board of School Education, Haryana /C.B.S.E., New Delhi.

(30 minutes are for completing pre-examination formalities and 2 ½ hours for solving question paper).

Medium of test is English and there is no negative marking.

- 4.4 General Instructions for Entrance Test for B.V.Sc. & A.H

- (1) Entry to the test centre will not be allowed without a valid Admit Card.
- (2) ENTRY IN ANY CASE WILL NOT BE ALLOWED AFTER 10.00 a.m.
- (3) Every candidate must sign again on the admit card available with supervisory staff at the time of Entrance Test.
- (4) Candidates must bring with them two ball pens with blue or black ink only. Electronic devices such as calculator, mobile phone, pager etc. are not allowed. Answer sheet of such candidates who use pencil or ball pen of any other colour or mixed blue and black colour shall not be evaluated and thus debarred from admission.
- (5) Before starting writing on the answer sheets, candidates must carefully check the booklet and report the shortcoming, if any, to the supervisory staff. Once the candidates start writing on the answer sheets, no replacement shall be allowed.

- (6) Cuttings and over writings are not allowed on answer sheets. Such answers will not be credited.
- 4.5 Result of test shall be displayed on the Notice Board of the Dean, College of Veterinary Sciences latest by 06.7.2011.
- 4.6 There is no provision for re-checking or re-evaluation of answer sheets and no enquiry in this regard shall be entertained.
- 4.7 Use of unfair means in Entrance Test-Penalty thereof:
- (i) Candidate(s) found guilty for use of unfair means (as defined below) shall be expelled from entrance test by Centre Superintendent/Registrar and their decision shall be final.
 - (a) Creating disturbance of any kind during entrance test or otherwise misbehaving in or around the entrance test centre or refusing to obey the Superintendent/Supervisor or changing his/her seat with any candidate.
 - b) Writing his/her name or putting any identification mark on the outer cover of question booklet or anywhere in the answer sheet. Having in his/her possession or accessible to him/her papers/books/notes which may possibly be of any assistance to him/her or found giving or receiving assistance or copying any paper/book/notes or allowing any other candidate to copy from his/her answer sheet or found writing on a paper other than his/her answer sheet or using or attempting to use any other unfair means during the entrance test.
 - c) Tampering with his/her roll number on the answer sheet.
 - d) Using cellular phones or any such device inside entrance test centres.
 - (ii) Any candidate found impersonating for another candidate or found being impersonated by another candidate during the entrance test, apart from expulsion from entrance test, shall be debarred from seeking admission to this University for two subsequent academic sessions and the case may be registered with the local police.
 - (iii) If use of unfair means is detected at the time of evaluation of answer sheets/ counselling or thereafter, the candidate (s) shall be disqualified and admission cancelled as the case may be and debarred from seeking admission to this University for two subsequent academic sessions.

4.8 Admission Procedure -B.V.Sc. & A.H.

Candidates who have qualified the Entrance Test shall be required to report on 12.7.2011 at 09.30 a.m. at the Auditorium of College of Veterinary Sciences for attendance and after obtaining attendance slip, report to the Admission Committee. Admission shall be allowed on the basis of availability of seat(s). Candidates admitted shall have to pay fees etc. there and then.

Candidates admitted are required to report for registration on due date(s) failing which they will forfeit their fee and claim of admission.

A candidate who refuses admission on his turn, will not be considered for admission to that programme again in the subsequent schedule.

5. GENERAL CONDITIONS GOVERNING UNDERGRADUATE & POSTGRADUATE ADMISSIONS:

5.1 No intimation letter regarding admission shall be sent to any candidate.

Candidates shall have to report to the Admission Committee as indicated in Annexure-I

Admission of foreigners shall, however, be made in absentia on the basis of documents received through the Competent Authority. Sponsoring Authority will be informed about admission of foreigners with a copy to the candidate.

5.2 The candidates shall get themselves medically examined (before depositing the fee etc.) from the Chief/Senior Medical Officer of the university, submit medical certificate to the Dean concerned, deposit the fee same day and complete registration on due date as indicated in Annexure-I. Candidates found medically unfit shall not be allowed admission. The admission of those candidates, who fail to report for registration on scheduled date, shall also stand cancelled and dues paid are not refundable.

5.3 Admission against reserved seats:

In case of reservation quota, merit will be determined inter se amongst the candidates belonging to that category. Roster system as in Annexure-II shall be followed for admitting the candidates belonging to various reserved categories. However, while filling the general quota seats under roster system, the combined merit list having reserved categories' candidates too, shall be considered. Before coming for the counselling, the candidates should study the admission rules carefully and make sure that they fulfill the qualifications prescribed for admission.

5.4 The admission procedure involves the following:

- (i) Submission of all original documents and verification at the time of 1st counselling fixed for them.
- (ii) Medical examination.
- (iii) Depositing the fee.
- (iv) Registration on due date.

Admission procedure will be completed only after registration for the programme on the dates notified.

5.5 Seats remaining vacant due to any reason after first schedule/counselling or main admission and seats fallen vacant subsequently due to any reason including non-registration by the students already admitted, shall be filled in on the date of 2nd schedule/counselling (final) and cut off date for admission as indicated for filling up of vacant seats in Annexure-I. "At the time of second counselling too, all the remaining candidates may be considered again in order of merit against vacant seats.

There will be no admission after the cut off date and seat(s) remaining vacant shall be treated as cancelled.

5.6 Presence of candidates:

Presence of the candidate is must for the following events failing which the admission shall be treated as cancelled. Fees and dues deposited shall stand forfeited and the seat considered vacant and filled up as per rules:

- (i) 1st counselling and admission date and time as indicated in (Annexure-I).
- (ii) On the date fixed for filling of vacant seats, i.e. 2nd counselling if interested to be considered for admission as per rule 5.5 of this Chapter.
- (iii) Medical examination
- (iv) On the date for registration (Annexure-I) or as mentioned in the admission order.

5.7 Submission of result of qualifying examination:

- (i) Result be submitted at the time of counselling to the Admission Committee, if not submitted alongwith admission form.
- (ii) In case, due to certain reasons, the result of a particular candidate is not declared alongwith general results he/she shall have no claim for admission if his/her result is declared after the counselling/verification of documents.

5.8 Self attested copies of the following documents are required to be attached with Admission form:

a) For all candidates

- i) Matric Certificate with Date of Birth and Father's name.
- ii) Haryana Resident Certificate (Annexure-V).
- iii) Character Certificate from the institute last attended. The candidates who have passed qualifying examination earlier and there is gap of more than one year (other than the pursuit of studies in an institution/college) shall give an affidavit duly attested by Public Notary/Notary regarding their non-enrolment in any institution.

Note-1: Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination as private candidate may submit their affidavit of Character Certificate duly attested by the Public Notary/Notary.

Note-2: Candidate appearing for Entrance Test to B.V.Sc. & A.H. must attach the following documents with admission form:

- a) Relevant certificate if benefit of reserved category is being claimed.
- b) Sponsorship certificate, if applying as sponsored candidate.
- c) Affix clear, coloured passport size photographs on admission form and both the admit cards (supplied with the admission form). The photographs on admission form and admit cards be attested by the Gazetted Officer/Principal of the School/College last attended

(avoid attestation on the face). Selected candidates are required to submit another similar attested photograph at the time of registration.

The photographs should be latest, without cap and dark glasses. If the photographs are old, are not similar or are with cap or dark glasses or disfigured by attesting authority, the application form will be rejected.

Attestation of photographs should not be on the face of the candidate.

b) For candidates seeking admission to B.V.Sc. & A.H.

In addition to certificates listed at (a) above, 10+2 or equivalent certificate.

c) For candidates seeking admission to M.V.Sc. programme

In addition to certificates listed at (a) and (b) above, Bachelor's degree and transcript/DMC showing marks/OGPA with conversion formula, if only OGPA is mentioned.

d) For candidates seeking admission to Ph.D. programme

In addition to certificates listed at (a) (b) and (c) above, Master's degree and transcript showing marks/OGPA with conversion formula, if only OGPA is mentioned.

Note: In case, result has been declared publically but certificate/degree of qualifying examination has not been issued by the concerned Board/University, candidates shall have to produce authentic proof of Provisional Degree Certificate/Mark sheet/OGPA from Head of the Institute (Annexure-XIV) last attended.

(e) For candidates claiming weightage

(i) Sports Certificate (SM)

(ii) NCC/CCA certificate.

(f) For candidates claiming reservation

(i) Scheduled caste certificate (SC) (Annexure-VI).

(ii) Backward class certificate (BC) (Annexure VII).

(iii) Physically handicapped certificate (PH) (Annexure VIII)

(iv) Ex-servicemen certificate (ESM) (Annexure-LX)

(v) Freedom Fighter Certificate (Annexure XI)

(g) Others

(i) In-service candidate certificate (Annexure-X)

(ii) No objection certificate (Annexure-XII)

(iii) Deceased employee certificate

6. Candidates having passed the qualifying examination from any other University and seeking admission to postgraduate programmes of this University shall have to produce the migration

- certificate from the previous institution latest by registration of 2nd semester of their study, failing which their admission shall be cancelled.
7. No column of admission form should be left blank. All entries especially category in the columns should be legibly filled in. Where the information is not applicable, it may be marked with 'Not Applicable' using abbreviation-NA.
 8. No certificate in original should be sent alongwith admission form. Only self attested copies should be attached. However, at the time of counselling all the original certificates should be produced.
 9. No correspondence with regard to return/loaning of certificates will be entertained whether the applicant is admitted to a programme or not. Similarly no request for verification/inspection of date of birth from certificates already submitted will be entertained.
 10. Admission to all the programmes will be made on merit. Merit will be determined as under :

PART-A

FOR HARYANA RESIDENTS SEATS

Admissions shall be made as per recommendations of the VCI, subject to the fulfillment of minimum pre-admission qualifications prescribed by the University.

For this purpose, the VCI conducts entrance test in which any candidate irrespective of his/her resident status can appear. Admission is made on the basis of merit in entrance test. More details are available in the Information Brochure issued by the VCI every year in the month of February/March. For any other details, the following Officer be consulted: -

11. Admission shall be made as per roster system at Annexure-II. However, while filling the general quota seats under roster system, the combined merit list having reserved categories' candidates too, shall be considered. Any candidate who remains absent on being called or refuses to accept admission on his/her turn as per roster system shall loose his/her right of admission. Seats lying vacant in any reserved category due to non-availability of eligible candidates will be added to general category and filled up in 1st counseling, if possible.
12. Under no circumstances, admission shall be allowed to any candidate who does not fulfil the minimum prescribed educational qualifications. Rules shall be followed in letter and spirit without any relaxation.

13. Weightage

For admission to Master's programmes, there will be weightage as under for those who fulfil minimum prescribed qualifications:

13.(a) Sports Weightage

i.	Participation in International Championship recognised by the concerned Games Federation	5 %
ii.	First three positions in a recognised National Championship, All India Inter-State Championship organised under the auspices of National Sports Federation/Association.	4 %
iii.	First three positions in All India Inter-University Championship organised under the auspices of AIU.	3 %
iv.	First three positions in the Zonal Inter-University Championship organised under the auspices of AIU or first three positions in Zonal Inter-State Championship organised under the auspices of National Sports Federation /Association or first two position in all India Inter Veterinary /Agricultural University Sports Meet under auspices of ICAR.	2 %
v.	Participation in the recognised National/All India Inter State/Zonal Inter-State Championship organised under the auspices of National Sports Federation /Association or first three positions in the State Championship organised under the auspices of the State Association or third place in all India Inter Veterinary/Agricultural University Sports Meet under auspices of ICAR.	1 %

Note :

1. Only the performance of preceding three years in the games as listed at Annexure XIII will be considered. The cut-off date for counting preceding three years will be 30th June of the year of admission.
2. Required eligibility performance will be considered only if the participation certificate of the lower level is attached or if for any reasons next lower championship has not taken place then a certificate

to this effect from the concerned authorities has to be attached/produced. However, the Admission Committee shall satisfy itself about the genuineness of sports certificates/performance of the concerned candidate while giving weightage to his/her sports performance.

3. Tournaments other than recognized national championships such as All India Rural Championships/ Women Sports Festival/Panchayat Tournaments/Nehru Yuva Kendra Tournaments/Sports Authority of India Tournaments/All India Chhaju Ram Tournaments/All India Sir Chhotu Ram Tournaments etc. will not be considered for any weightage for sports.

13. (b) For Co-curricular Activities

Such as debates, drama, graphic arts, music etc. the weightage for achievements made during residential requirements of a programme is as under :

13.(d) Institutional Weightage

Weightage of 5% marks is granted to such candidates who have passed qualifying examination from LLRUVAS/CCSHAU for admission to the programmes available in this university provided that no weightage shall be allowed for the programmes where admission is made on the basis of entrance test. Institutional weightage shall be in addition to the weightage listed in foregoing rules.

- 13.1 The weightage is only indicative and is subject to change from time to time.
- 13.2 The weightage should be added to the percentage of marks obtained by the candidates in the qualifying examination, i.e., if a candidate has secured 50% marks in the qualifying examination and has obtained first position in a recognised National Championship/All India Inter-State Championship organised under the auspices of National Sports Federation/ Association, 5% marks would be added to the percentage of marks obtained by him/her i.e. he/she would be treated as having secured 55% marks.
- 13.3 Those who are eligible for reservation are also eligible for weightage for a particular category, in addition to his/her placing in the reserved category.
- 13.4 Candidates can claim only one weightage (highest weightage) out of the weightages meant for sports category, co-curricular activities, NCC and NSS. Institutional weightage shall however be in addition.
- 13.5 Weightage for co-curricular activities, NCC and NSS shall be allowed for the achievements attained during the regular period of residential requirements of the qualifying degree programme.

14. Eligibility for ICAR nominees for Ph. D. degree programmes (Rule 9 (i) of Chapter IV)

- (a) In-service candidates from State Veterinary Universities/State Agricultural Universities/ICAR Institutes.
- (b) Foreign candidates holding Govt. of India scholarships and routed through ICAR-DARE.
- (c) Foreign candidates sponsored by their Governments with scholarships and routed through ICAR-DARE.

Note: If ICAR nominees are not available, the seats may be offered to the inservice candidates of State Veterinary Universities/State Agricultural Universities/ ICAR Institutes. The Counselling/admissions for such candidate will be held within 15 days after 2nd (final) counselling.

15. Definition of Physically Handicapped (Rule 8 (iii) of Chapter IV)

Candidates having permanent disability of not less than 40%, provided the candidate is otherwise fit for admission. Such candidates will have to bring a certificate in Annexure-VIII from Chief Medical Officer of the District to which the candidate belongs.

Such candidates will also have to appear before the Medical Board constituted by the Vice-Chancellor for determining the percentage of disability and for assessment whether they are fit to carry out the duties despite being handicapped. However, VCI regulations shall be followed for this category for the admission to B. V.Sc. & A.H. programme which make the candidate ineligible if suffering from the following physical disabilities :

- a) Disability of total body including disability of chest/spine more than 50%.
- b) Disability of lower limb of more than 50%.
- c) Disability of upper limb.
- d) Visually handicapped candidates and those with hearing disability
- e) Candidates with progressive diseases like myopathies etc.
- f) Disabilities which otherwise would interfere in the performance of the duties of a Veterinarian.

16. Criteria for admission against the seats reserved for Ex-servicemen (Note under Rule 8 (ii) of Chapter IV).

Seats under this category may be filled in the following order:

- a) Wives/sons/daughters of military persons killed in operation.
- b) Wives/sons/daughters of military persons permanently disabled in action.

Note: The above preference order shall be followed irrespective of merit in the qualifying examination/ merit in entrance test.

- c) Others.

17. Same marks in Entrance Test or otherwise

- a) If there are more than one candidate with same marks in the entrance test, merit amongst the candidates with same marks may be decided at the time of counselling on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying examinations. If in the qualifying examinations the marks are the same, the merit will be on the basis of next lower board's examination. If still the marks are the same in the lower board's examination, then the senior in age will be senior in merit.
- b) In case of admission without entrance test, if there are more than one candidate with the same percentage of marks, merit amongst the candidates with the same marks may be decided at the time of counselling in the following order of priority:
 - (i) Merit of qualifying examination without any weightage.
 - (ii) Merit in the next lower university/board examination.
 - (iii) Merit on the basis of seniority in age.

In case of any doubt, decision of the Vice-Chancellor will be final.

18. Minimum educational requirements for admission.

B.V.Sc. & A.H.

10+2 having passed with Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English or equivalent from a recognised Board University with atleast 50% marks in aggregate in these four subjects (40% marks in aggregate for SC & BC categories). Minimum age 17 years on or before 31st December 2011.

19. M.V.Sc. Programme :

The minimum qualifications for admissions of fresh as well as in-service candidates excluding optional subjects shall be 65% marks (where OGPA is not given) or a grade point average of 6.5 (10.00 basis) in B.V.Sc. & A.H. (recognised by VCI). In-service candidates should apply through proper channel.

20. Ph. D. Programme

The minimum qualifications for admission of fresh as well as in-service candidates shall be 70% marks (where OGPA is not given) or a grade point average of 7.0 (10.00 basis) at Master's level in the subject concerned from a recognized University. No candidate will be allowed to do M.V.Sc./Ph.D. in two allied disciplines from this university i.e. in case a student has already done/is doing M.V.Sc./Ph.D. in one discipline, he/she would not be allowed to take admission in another allied discipline. No weightage as specified in rule 13 will be given. Special requirement of subjects for admission to various disciplines is given below :

1. Candidates must have completed master's programme and result notified or have completed their viva-voce examination by the date of counselling.
 2. Applications of in-service candidates accompanied by the certificate as at Annexure-X must reach the Registrar through proper channel, by the last date prescribed. The candidates may, however, submit advance copy but must ensure submission of a copy through proper channel by the date of counselling.

22. The major and minor courses shall be according to the requirements for the particular programme to which a candidate is admitted. The courses required to be taken by the candidate in order to meet certain deficiencies shall be over and above the minimum requirements and these are called deficiency courses. These shall be entered in the programme of work in the appropriate columns. The deficiency courses have to be completed by the student before he/she is entitled to receive the degree and in each of these courses he/she shall be awarded 'S' or 'US' grade. The student must get 60% marks or more for getting 'S' grade in the deficiency course. However, the grade(s) obtained will not be counted towards the calculation of the OGPA.
23. At the time of selection/admission, the Dean/Registrar/Admission Committee shall also consider the past record of the candidate, concerning his/her conduct as a student/employee in this University or elsewhere. If the authority is satisfied that the applicant/student/ employee as the case may be, being considered for admission was involved in acts of indiscipline, organizing demonstration, involvement in criminal offences specially involved in immoral aptitude, the Dean/Registrar/Admission Committee may refuse admission to such a candidate.
24. A person aggrieved by any decision of the Dean/Registrar/Admission Committee may appeal to the Vice-Chancellor within three days, who will examine the application with reference to rules and regulations and decision of the Vice-Chancellor in the matter shall be final.
- Note:**
1. Short duration has been provided for appeal as in the matters of admissions the time bound schedule is to be followed.
 2. Admissions to all UG and PG programmes of the University will be made by the Registrar. The Registrar shall accordingly register the students after payment of the prescribed fees. If it is found, at anytime, that a candidate obtained admission to a programme by misrepresentation of facts or that candidate has availed some benefit which was not due to him/her or if a candidate has been admitted due to an error, the Registrar may cancel his/her admission to UG and PG programmes.
25. NRI/NRI sponsored/Industry sponsored seats for B.V.Sc. & A.H. Programme:
- (i) The admission under this category will be given only to NRIs, their children/wards, NRI sponsored/ Industry sponsored candidates. The eligibility requirements for this programme are the same as for general category candidates. However, the candidates who have completed their qualifying examination or equivalent abroad are required to submit a copy of their certificate/ transcript/ marks sheet indicating grades and % equivalent marks, duly verified and certified by the Indian Embassy/ High Commission in that country, stating that such examination is equivalent to the qualifying examination (10+2) of Indian Universities/education boards. Additionally, they will also be required to submit an application for obtaining the requisite equivalence certificate from the Registrar LLRUVAS, Hisar by paying a fee of US\$ 500 (non-refundable) through a bank draft in favour of the Comptroller, LLRUVAS, Hisar payable at any scheduled bank at Hisar.

- (ii) The NRI candidates or their children/wards seeking admission to B.V.Sc. & A.H. programme will have to apply on the prescribed Admission form and they will be considered for admission without appearing in the entrance test of the university provided they have passed 12th standard level examination with 50% marks in aggregate in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English, subject to verification of its equivalence with the 10+2 examination (Medical Group) of the Central Board of Secondary Education/ Board of School Education, Haryana by an appropriate authority. The detail of subjects studied, grades and % equivalent marks obtained is to be furnished in the application form.
- (iii) The preference of admission will be for NRIs or their children/wards followed by NRI sponsored (**Annexure-XV**) and then Industry sponsored (**Annexure-XVI**) candidates. While admitting the candidates under these categories, preference shall be given to residents of Haryana over the residents of other states. However, the fee structure will remain the same except the amount for Industry sponsored candidates will be taken in equivalent of Indian Rupees. The conversion rate will be the prevailing average of buying and selling rates of US \$ at SBI on the day of deposition of fee. The payment will have to be made in the form of Demand Draft/Banker's cheque drawn in favour of Comptroller, LLRUVAS, Hisar.

CHAPTER - IV

ADMISSION CAPACITY

1. The number of seats etc. for the purpose of admissions are decided by the Academic Council as per provisions of Section 15 of Lala Lajpat Rai University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Hisar Act, 2010. All other provisions regarding the admission policy etc. are governed by the provisions of the above said Act and Statutes and any other rule framed by the Competent Authority from time to time as prescribed under this Act.
2. Admission to B.V.Sc. & A.H. and M.V.Sc./Ph.D programmes are made from 1st semester. Admission to Ph.D. programme for vacant seats are also made from 2nd semester.

3. In case, candidates are not available in either block of BC, the seats shall be filled up from the candidates of other block of relevant category except for Ph.D. programme.

4. As is clear from the number of seats indicated on pre pages, the seats are either for Haryana Residents or for the candidates who have appeared in the Entrance Test conducted by the ICAR/VCI and allowed admission by the respective bodies during their counselling programme. However, the unfilled seats in all Ph.D. programmes may be filled up by the applicants of other States who have passed their Master's programme from a Constituent College of State Agricultural/Veterinary Universities or ICAR Institutes, if no eligible candidates are available from Haryana. Such candidates may however report to the Admission Committee on cut off date when the position regarding the vacant seats shall be clear.

No application on any ground, received after the date of verification of documents/counselling shall be entertained.
- iii) No Admission orders will be dispatched by the University.
- iv) Foreign nationals admitted to UG and P.G. programmes and unable to join in the Semester in which session starts because of certain formalities, be allowed extension of one semester by the Dean, COVS and Dean, PGS, respectively.

- (b) In case of other institutions or Universities where no equivalent percentage of marks is expressly provided, but the conversion formula of the OPGA awarded has been given by the concerned University concerned, the percentage of marks would be obtained by using the conversion formula of that University.
- (c) In case of other Institutions or Universities where no equivalent percentage of marks is given or no formula for conversion of the OGPA is expressly provided, the percentage of marks will be calculated on the basis of the following simple linear formula. Example:
- (i) If a candidate gets 4 on a scale of 5, his percentage of marks would be
- $$4/5 \times 100 = 80\%$$
- (ii) If a candidate gets an OGPA of 7 on a scale of 10, his percentage of marks will be

CHAPTER - II

INTRODUCTION

MEANING AND SCOPE OF THE PROSPECTUS

It is a brief compilation of informations and not an exhaustive detail of all the regulations made by the competent authority in this regard. The provisions of the Prospectus are in the shape of guidelines which are available to the candidates seeking admissions and do not in any manner limit the power of any Competent Authority in making additional regulations regarding the admissions of the students in the university from time to time.

Admissions are made in accordance with the admission rules. Since it is not possible to mention detailed procedure in the Prospectus, admission rules are to be read with the instructions issued/to be issued from time to time with the approval of the Academic Council/Competent Authority.

COMPETENT AUTHORITY

The original jurisdiction to make regulations regarding the admissions of the students in the University is vested in the Academic Council of Lala Lajpat Rai University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Hisar (Established by Haryana Legislature Act No. 7, 2010 herein after referred to as Act, 2010). The provisions as reproduced in the Prospectus or the guidelines as provided in this Prospectus shall not make precedent over the powers of the Academic Council as provided in Section 15 of the Act, 2010 and the powers of the Vice-Chancellor as contained in Section 21 of the Act, 2010 and any of the provisions of the Act, 2010 and the subsequent Statutes framed by the University from time to time.

Any provisions or guidelines provided in the Prospectus are not final and are subject to modifications made by the Competent Authority under the Act & Statutes and if superseded by such decision by the Competent Authority, the latter will prevail and the information given in the Prospectus shall stand modified to that extent automatically.

THE UNIVERSITY

The Lala Lajpat Rai University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences established by Haryana Legislature Act No. 7 of 2010 came into existence on December 1, 2010 at Hisar to serve the society by promoting the livestock production, health and prevention of the diseases through integrated teaching, research and extension programmes.

THE UNIVERSITY CAMPUS

The main campus of the University is situated at Hisar at a distance of 172 KM North-West of Delhi on National Highway No. 10 and is 2 ½ KM from the railway station and 3 KM from the Bus Stand.

COLLEGE OF VETERINARY SCIENCES

The College of Veterinary Sciences is a daughter institution of Veterinary School established at Poona in 1862 with one year course, which was later upgraded as the first Veterinary College at Lahore in 1882. A part of the Lahore Veterinary College was shifted to Hisar in 1948 after partition. Later, the College of Veterinary Medicine was set up in 1969 as a constituent college of Punjab Agricultural University, Ludhiana. Afterward in 1971, the college was renamed as College of Veterinary Sciences and became part of HAU, Hisar. Now this college is a part of Lala Lajpat Rai University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Hisar. The college was created to be a centre of regional, national and international excellence in learning in animal health and production. It caters to the needs of Haryana by carrying out teaching, research and extension education programmes pertaining to livestock health and production and has been instrumental in ushering an era of 'White Revolution' in the State.

The college has highly competent and experienced faculty members who have made significant contributions in research on animal health and production and won various national and international awards. The Minimum Standards of Veterinary Education Degree Course (B.V.Sc.&A.H.) Regulations, 1993 of Veterinary Council of India (VCI), subsequently revised in 2008, have been implemented in the college. This college has 17 departments having excellent laboratory facilities and adequate infrastructure for the undergraduate and postgraduate teaching and research, a well equipped veterinary teaching hospital to cater to the demands of large and small animal health care. The college offers the following programmes of study:

- (i) B.V.Sc. & A.H.
- (ii) M.V.Sc.
- (iii) Ph.D.

The successful completion of B.V.Sc.&A.H. programme entitles the graduates for registration with the Haryana State Veterinary Council / Veterinary Council of India as registered veterinary practitioners.

LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SERVICES

Lala Lajpat Rai University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Hisar is presently sharing the library and information services of CCSHAU, Hisar, where Nehru Library, the hub of academic and research activities of the university, is housed in a centrally located elegant building. The library opens for 15-16 hours daily throughout the year. It has six Reading Halls with cozy reading environment where 650 readers can sit and study at a time. Book Bank is a very popular service with the students who are entitled to borrow four textbooks each from its collection at nominal charges. Bookshop is a service unique to this library as no other library supports this activity. The students and teachers can buy books from the Bookshop at discounts ranging from 10 to 35% against a market discount structure of 10-15%. Photocopying service is provided at very cheaper rates.

Videoconferencing facility, Multimedia library, Internet Lab, more than 2387 e-journals are the other facilities available in the library. The Library also provides full text access of more than 4000 Agricultural Doctoral Dissertations submitted to all SAUs/DAUs during the years 2000-07.

DIRECTORATE OF STUDENTS' WELFARE

The Directorate is responsible for the welfare of students and helps in their counselling and placement, cultural and sports activities. Presently, Lala Lajpat Rai University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Hisar, with its own hostels, is sharing the students' welfare facilities of CCSHAU, Hisar.

(a) Giri Centre for Sports Activities

The Giri Centre for students' sports activities is an outstanding feature of the University. It has two indoor badminton courts, two indoor squash courts, hobby rooms, two multipurpose indoor gymnasium. A synthetic track of international standard has also been provided in the athletic stadium.

(b) Hostel Facilities

Accommodation is provided in hostels where all comfortable facilities, furniture, TV with cable connection, indoor recreational facilities, leading News Papers and Magazines and solar water heating system are provided. All the hostels have EPABX phone facilities as well as incoming calls facilities. Two hostel wardens look after the management of each hostel. Every hostel has been provided water cooler with aqua-guard for safe drinking water. The mess, in the hostels, is managed by the residents themselves on co-operative basis.

(c) Co-curricular Activities

The Directorate of Students' Welfare is also responsible for promotion of all co-curricular activities such as Sports, NCC, NSS, Mountaineering, Graphic Arts, Literary, Music, Dance, Drama, NIS etc.

(d) Students Counselling and Placement Cell

The Counselling & Placement Cell of the Directorate in association with the Department of Employment, Haryana, has set up a University Employment Information and Guidance Bureau which provides information to the students on job opportunities, competitive examinations, scholarships/fellowship etc. It also conducts trainings/coaching classes for the entrance examinations and explores the job opportunities in the public and private sectors and arranges the campus interviews.

MEDICAL SERVICES

There is a well-equipped 50 bed Hospital in the university. The Hospital has a physician, surgeon and dentist. Medical aid is provided round the clock to the students, staff and other trainees.
