- (ii) A student who for certain compelling reasons has to leave the college with the permission of the Dean during the currency of a professional year, will be re-admitted by the Dean within a period of one year of leaving the college.

Note: A student governed under the above rule will be re-admitted in the same professional year in the next academic year.

(2) Re-admission after leaving studies

Provision of mid programme exit option for the students after 1st professional year: - Any student can withdraw during any professional year from 2nd to 4th Professional year due to any of the personal reasons (including financial/ medical/familial) with due permission of Dean of the college (only after successful completion of the First Professional year of his/her studies).

- (i) A student who leaves college at the end of professional year with prior permission of the Dean of the College shall be eligible for re-admission provided he/she seeks re-admission within three years of leaving the college.
- (ii) A student who for certain compelling reasons has to leave the college with the permission of the Dean during the currency of a professional year, will be re-admitted by the Dean within a period of three years of leaving the college.

Note:

- a) A student governed under the above rule (ii) will be re-admitted in the same professional year during the next academic year.
- b) Provided further that he/she has to apply to the Dean of the College at least 15 days before the commencement of registration of the next academic year.
- c) In case of service matter, the student should intimate the University well in advance or within three days of joining the service. If student fails to intimate the University within stipulated period, he/she may submit the special request for post facto permission to join the service and to drop/exit his/her studies to the Registrar through Dean of the College with valid justification along with a late fee of Rs. 100/- per day from the date of joining service.
- d) In case, the student has joined any service he/she will have to produce the NOC and EOL proof from the employer along with permission for joining back/ readmission for completion of under graduate Degree Programme.
- e) He/she will be allowed to re-join service only after successful completion of the Degree Programme only. If he/she wishes to leave the course again in-between for joining the service etc. he/she will not be allowed readmission.
- f) The re-admission will be at the discretion of the Dean of the College with final decision
